## Church Member Helen Halliday



Helen Bernice (Watson) Halliday was born to Joe and Zula Watson on June 13, 1930 near Dierks, Arkansas.

I am a country girl. My dad loved to train horse. He also taught me to love horses and ride well. My mom was a homemaker and gardener. I love to work in the house, but not the garden...LOL. I was very fortunate that my grandparents on both sides also lived in the same community. My mom, dad and I attended Green's Chapel Methodist Church. I became a member at the end of a revival when I was 13 years old.

After high school, I moved to Dallas for a job. I met a handsome young man by the name of Phil Halliday who was getting out of the service at the same time. We found jobs, started dating and married in a little Methodist Church in Oak Cliff, Texas. Phil was born and raised in a little town called Horatio, Arkansas, which just happened to be 30 miles from my hometown of Dierks, Arkansas. We lived in Oak Cliff in a duplex house and in 1959 we purchased our new home in Mesquite, Texas with our then two children, Gary and Charlotte and this is where I still live today. Our last two children, Liz and Cindy, were later born and we raised all of them there. We had a wonderful life!

In 1964, we were looking for a church home when we found out that St. Marks UMC was being built. This made us very happy. I was at the first service, but didn't join the church until early 1965. Our four children grew up at St. Marks and became Christians while attending there. All the youth activities were great and they still talk about them today and the friendships they made. One of our family's fondest memories at St. Marks is during the Christmas season and going to the Candlelight service on Christmas Eve. During this time of year, we also loved decorating our Christmas tree at home while listening to Christmas music. On Christmas morning we would gather around the tree and celebrate the birth of Jesus by reading the Christmas story from the bible before opening presents and had a feast. Even after our children married, they would come back home on Christmas morning and carrying on our family



tradition. We continued doing this until Phil became ill with MDS. After a lengthy illness, he went to heaven on July 7, 2011. Since then, Cindy and her husband, Dale, hosted Christmas morning at their house. Liz and her husband, Mark, host Thanksgiving at their house.

Phil and I have 10 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren. We are so blessed!! After I retired from Mesquite ISD in 1996 and Phil retired a year later, we loved and enjoyed going to Phil's home place in Horatio, Arkansas with our whole family. Phil loved fishing in the family pond with the older grandchildren and catching crawfish in the creek with the younger ones. I enjoyed every moment and taking pictures of the memories we were making. All of our children and grandchildren also learned how to play 42 (an old domino game) during this time. In the last six months, my health has prevented me from attending church service and activities at St. Marks. I really have missed seeing and worshipping with my church family.
